## Warning Order - 243 RCACS ANNUAL CEREMONIAL REVIEW & LUNCHEON - 31 MAY & 01 JUNE

- 1. The Annual Ceremonial Review (ACR) is the most important event of the Air Cadet training year. This **mandatory event** is the opportunity for the cadets to display what they have learned over the past training year to their families and guests. It is also the opportunity for the Squadron to honor deserving cadets by presenting them with various awards.
- 2. Cadets are to be dropped off at the KF Centre for Excellence (5800 Lapointe Drive) on:

a. Friday May 31 1800 – 2100h (6:00pm-9:00pm) <u>and</u> b. Saturday June 1 0730 – 1500h (7:30am – 3:00pm)

- 3. Cadets are asked to arrive in *civilian attire* Friday evening and to bring all their uniform parts on hangers and in bags with them. Uniforms will be stored at the KF Centre for Excellence until Saturday morning. Cadets should arrive in *civilian* attire Saturday morning, and they will change into uniform before the parade. Cadets should have their hair done before arrival on Saturday.
- 4. Cadets should eat a healthy breakfast prior to arriving Saturday morning. See Kit list for detailed instructions. All uniform parts should be labelled with each Cadet's last name.
- 5. Family members and guests are invited to arrive at 1020hrs to be seated for a 1040hrs parade start. After the Reviewing Party has viewed the displays, there will be a light luncheon available for Cadets only. The luncheon is being provided by the Sponsoring Committee and is free to our Cadets. The luncheon will be less formal than the parade and more presentations will be awarded.

## Annex A – ACR 2024 Cadet Kit List

- 1. All items of kit should include your last name, first initial on the clothing. Names should be written on the clothing tag, not covering up any sizing information.
- 2. Do not bring any items of value, as there is no area to lock these items up. The squadron takes no ownership of lost or damaged items.

- 3. Cadets with long hair must secure their hair neatly with one of the following styles so as the hair is out of their face and collar:
  - a. In a bun;
  - b. A single braid;
  - c. Double braids centred to the back;
  - d. Multi braids or locks, be pulled back to the centre of the back or equally positioned along the shoulder blades and secured; or
  - e. When hairstyle or hair type does not allow a cadet to adopt one of the aforementioned hairstyles, the cadet must discuss with the Chain of Command to find a hairstyle that can be secured accordingly.
- 4. A maximum of two rings may be worn and only a single or single set of stud or single stone earrings (one in each ear) are permitted.
- 5. Male Cadets should shave on Saturday morning prior to arriving at the KF Centre for Excellence. It is recommended to get a haircut the day prior to the ceremony.
